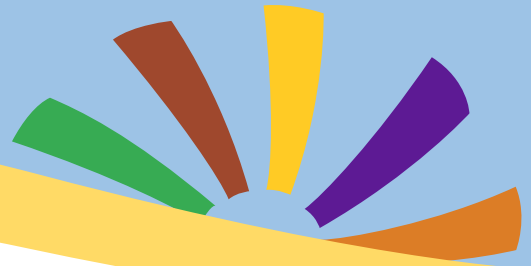
\*Suspension and expulsion from child care can have long-lasting negative effects on both children and families. It is the intent of the NC DCDEE to severely limit the use of these exclusionary practices in programs serving children birth—five. This informational meeting will acquaint facility administrators and owners with NC's new Suspension/Expulsion Policy and explore the importance of promoting healthy social-emotional development in preventing the challenging behaviors which often lead to suspension/expulsion. Also included are effective program policies and procedures which support the shift from exclusion to retention of young children.

- \* Technical Assistance is a viable strategy for improving the quality of child care in this country. It helps child care programs achieve higher levels of quality. TA Providers are invited to attend this 20 hour (2.0 CEU) learning session to enhance their TA skills. During the training, participants will: define the role of the TA Practitioner; review approaches of TA which include knowledge of effective communication strategies & recognition of cultural diversity in early childhood setting; recognize the role of the TA Practitioner as a change agent using appropriate models & practices; and assist TA Practitioners in developing a responsive professional development plan providing self-assessment, reflection, growth, & leadership opportunities. This training is divided into 4 Modules with Module 1 & Module 3 being completed as independent assignments before attending Module 2 & Module 4.

In this training, learn how trauma effects children, children's common reactions to crises and best practices to facilitate their short- and long-term emotional recovery. Learn about and discuss methods for caring for yourself as a caregiver so you can effectively support the recovery of the children and families you serve.

Presenter: Sandra Arasim

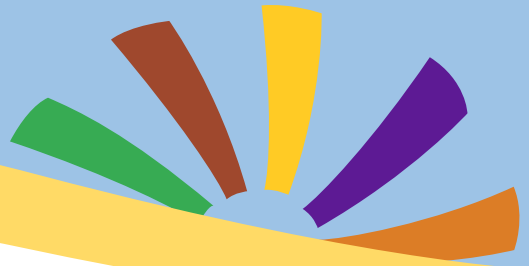
- \* First everything is “mine”, then children learn to take turns, and eventually they learn to share. For infants and toddlers this learning happens through relationships and includes developing a sense of self, a sense of self with others, and learning about feelings. All children need an emotionally secure environment that supports healthy development in this learning domain. This workshop examines social/emotional competence as a vital component of later school readiness. Participants will learn how a responsive caregiver can help the youngest of our children form secure attachments, learn to navigate feelings and emotions, and begin to develop self-regulation and social skills, the building blocks for future learning. This training provides information that supports the ITERS-R subscales: Listening and Talking and Interactions. (DCDEE 3,7)

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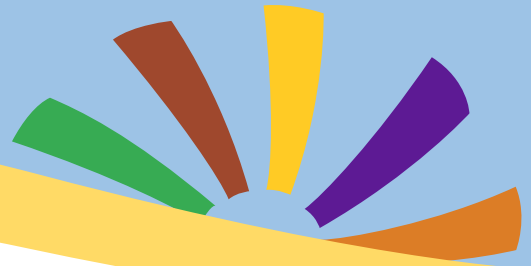
