## **REVISED INSTRUCTIONS for VIRTUAL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS**

*Please read carefully before registering for any of our courses.*

Beaufort-Hyde Partnership for Children (BHPC) is offering all professional development training opportunities virtually until further notice.

### **GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION**

1. Complete the registration sheet form found on our website at [www.bhckids.org](http://www.bhckids.org) under the early educator tab. You may also pick up a registration sheet at our office. Trainings for most 2-hour workshops start at \$8. Continuing Education Credits (CEUs) will vary.
2. **To register for virtual workshops, please make sure you have access to:**
  - o Internet with working email address
  - o ZOOM App
  - o Computer with speaker, microphone, video camera (*Cell phones are not recommended.*)
  - o Uninterrupted time & space to successfully take the training
  - o Materials for notetaking
3. **Registrations must be received in our office by 12:00 noon on the day BEFORE the training takes place.** (*Example: If training is on Tuesday, the registration period ends on Monday at 12:00 pm*). You may bring completed registration forms by the office with **EXACT PAYMENT** before this deadline. **FYI-BHPC OFFICE IS OPEN BY APPOINTMENT ONLY ON FRIDAYS.**
4. **Once BHPC accepts your registration form, the following will be sent back to your email:**
  - ONLINE PRE-ASSESSMENT,
  - LINK TO JOIN THE TRAINING,
  - HANDOUTS and ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS (*if applicable*)

**Return the completed PRE-Assessment no later than 12 noon on the date of the training.** YOU WILL NOT BE ADMITTED TO THE TRAINING UNLESS WE RECEIVE YOUR PRE-ASSESSMENT ON TIME.

5. **TO RECEIVE YOUR CERTIFICATE:** After the live Zoom Training, you will complete the online post test and evaluation to send back to us. Once both are returned, your password protected **CERTIFICATE OF ATTENDANCE** will be emailed to you. Modification to the certificate document is strictly prohibited and considered fraud.

### **GENERAL GUIDELINES & ETIQUETTE**

1. Space is limited so register early and don't wait until the last minute.
2. Occasionally, BHPC may offer FREE virtual trainings at our discretion. Beaufort and Hyde County programs have priority, but participants outside may also register.
3. Must have at least 3 participants for training to take place. You will be notified on the day before the training if it must be cancelled.
4. Most trainings will be held from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm unless noted. No one will be admitted to the training after 6:40 pm, so we **urge you to join the training at least 15 minutes before it begins.**
5. **REMEMBER:** If you sign up for a training, we expect you to be there during the entire period. Credit **CANNOT** be issued if you can't stay the entire time. BHPC staff will use various methods of monitoring to ensure your virtual attendance throughout the session via camera and speakers.
6. **Cameras are expected to remain on during the entire training.**
7. If an emergency arises and you can't attend, BHPC must be notified by 12:00 noon on the day of the training. Failure to do so may jeopardize your chances of participating in any subsequent free trainings.

# CCR&R Training Policies & Procedures

1. All payments are due at time of registration. Trainings/classes are filled on a first paid/first registered basis. Training fees must be brought into CCR&R during normal business hours, Monday—Friday, 8:00am—5:00pm, in person at our office, or mailed to 2111 Neuse Blvd Suite F, New Bern, NC 28560. Employees of CCR&R/Craven Smart Start are not allowed to take any money outside of the office, or after normal business hours.
2. A registration form must accompany all payments for each participant. Registration forms are attached to the Training Calendar, can be picked up at our office, or can be accessed online at [www.cravensmartstart.org](http://www.cravensmartstart.org). A registration form must be submitted for all trainings.
3. All fees and registration forms are due 2 days before a scheduled training by 5:00pm, unless otherwise stated on the Training Calendar. No participants will be added to a Training Roster after the registration date closes.
4. No refunds will be given. A credit for future trainings will be given if a class is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances on the part of CCR&R, or the minimum number of participants is not reached.
5. Cancellations must be made at least 24 hours in advance. A training credit will be issued if a paid participant calls to cancel at least 24 hours in advance of the training. Individuals who miss a training (for any reason) will not be given a credit unless they called 24 hours in advance.
6. Substitutions of participants will not be allowed.
7. Individuals who are on the CCR&R "No Services List" are not eligible to attend trainings with CCR&R until all fines are paid in full.
8. Unless otherwise stated, each class/training must have a minimum of 5 paid participants to be held. If the required number of participants is not met by the registration deadline, the class will be canceled, and registered participants will receive a credit that can be used towards future trainings.

## Registration

1. Each participant must have their own individual email and personal phone number listed. All correspondence is being completed through email and phone. It is important to have your personal email and phone number so that each participant can be individually contacted.
2. We will not be able accept registration forms from providers at the same location using the facility phone number and/or email.

3. Each participant must complete the registration form separately.
4. **The demographic survey, pre-survey, and possible pre-assessment (depending on the training) must be completed BEFORE the evening of the training.
